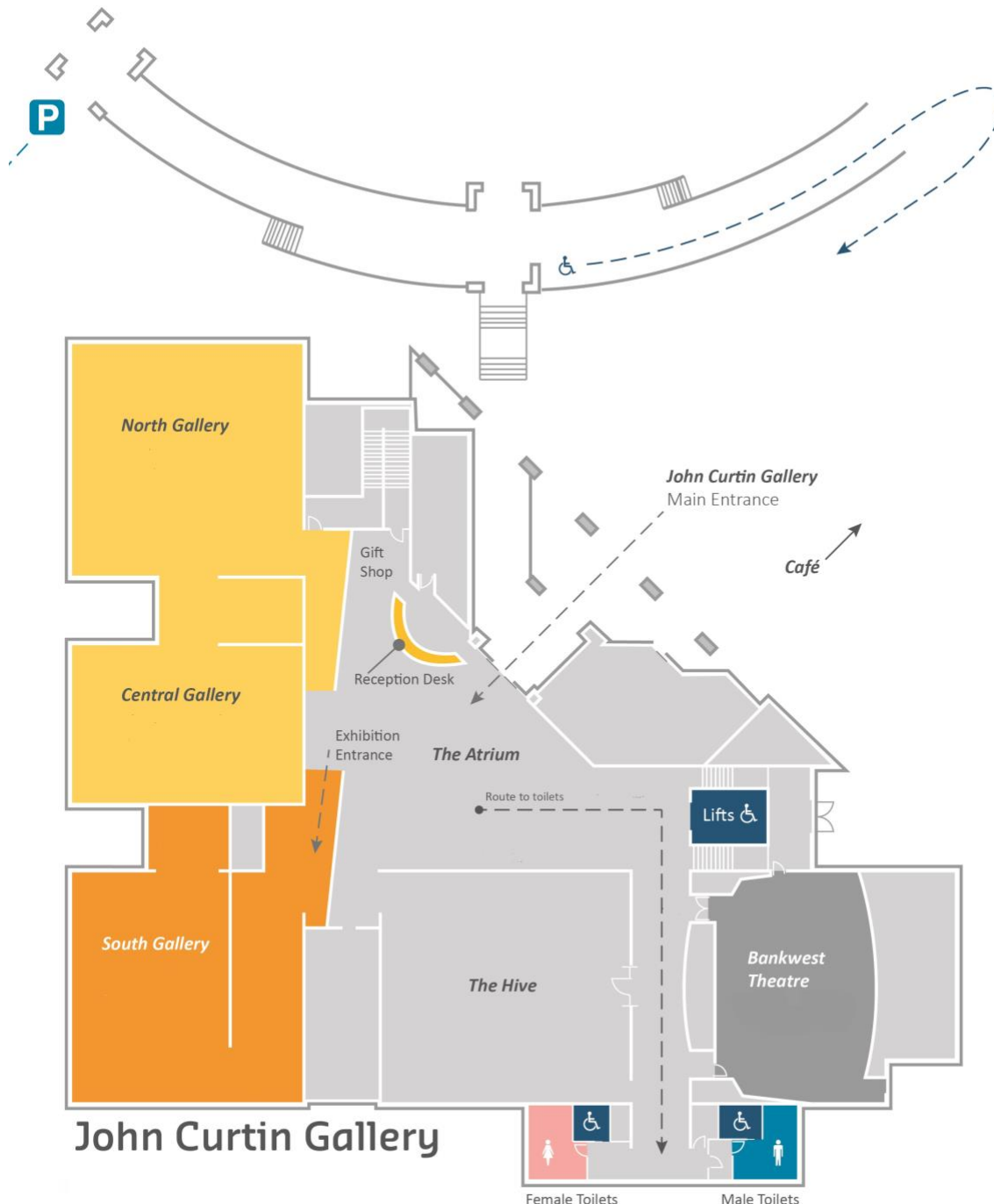

Below is a map of the Gallery and surrounds.



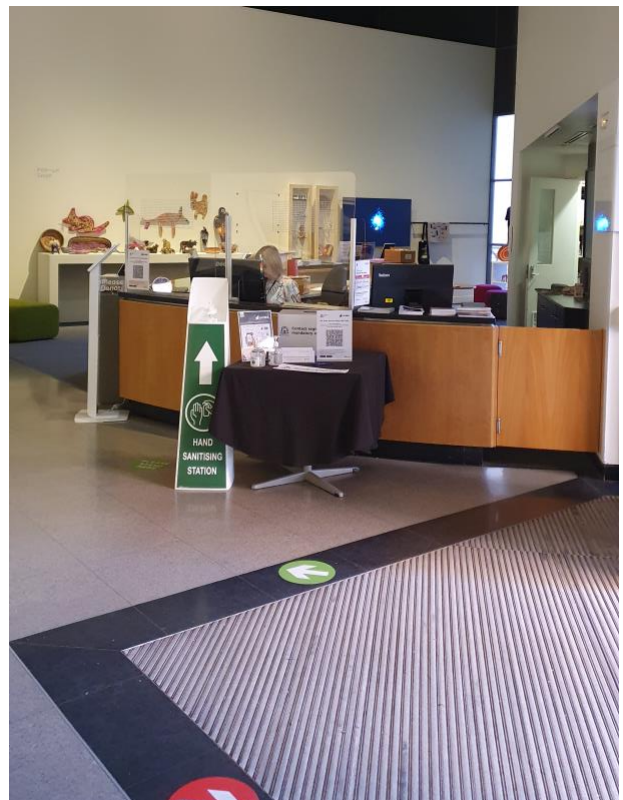
Please note: the Gallery spaces (yellow and orange) may change between exhibitions.

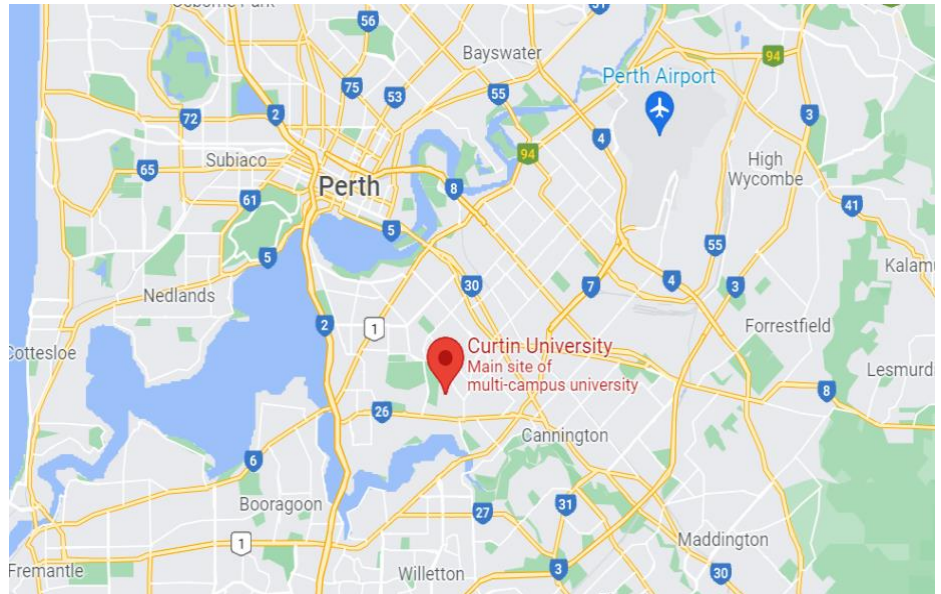


# Getting to the gallery

**This map shows where Curtin University is in Perth**



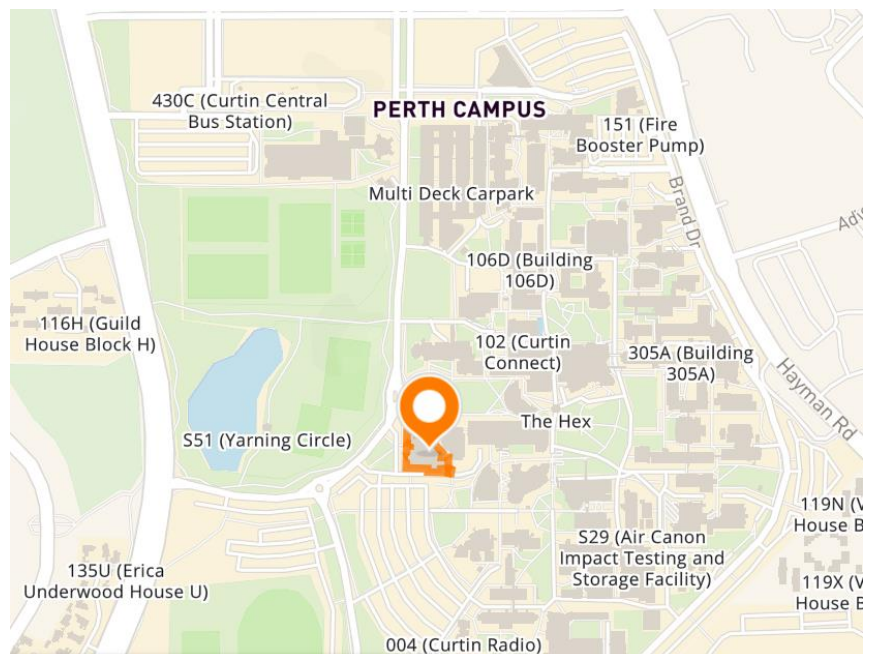
**This map shows where the John Curtin Gallery is on the Bentley Campus**

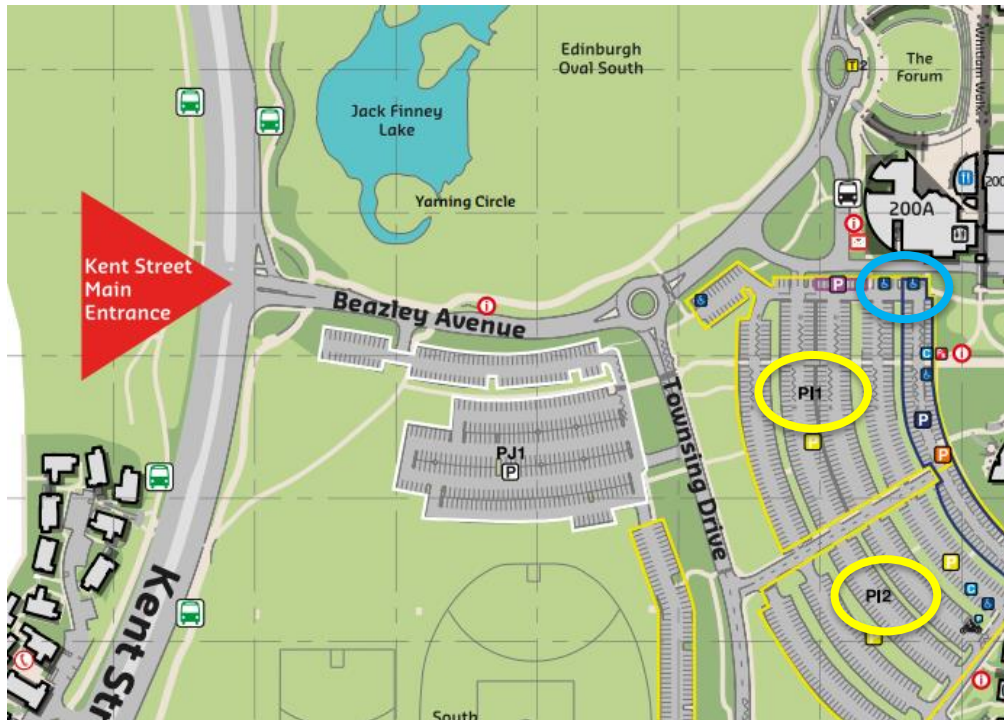




## Parking

The closest place to the gallery to park is the yellow zones P11 and P12 off Beazley Avenue. There are ACROD parking places close to the Gallery (in the blue circle).

At Curtin, you need to use an app called CellOPark to pay for parking. To use CelloPark, you need to register. Once you're registered, you can start parking straight away. On weekdays parking in the yellow zones cost \$1.55 per hour, up to a maximum of \$6.30 per day.

## Taking public transport to the gallery

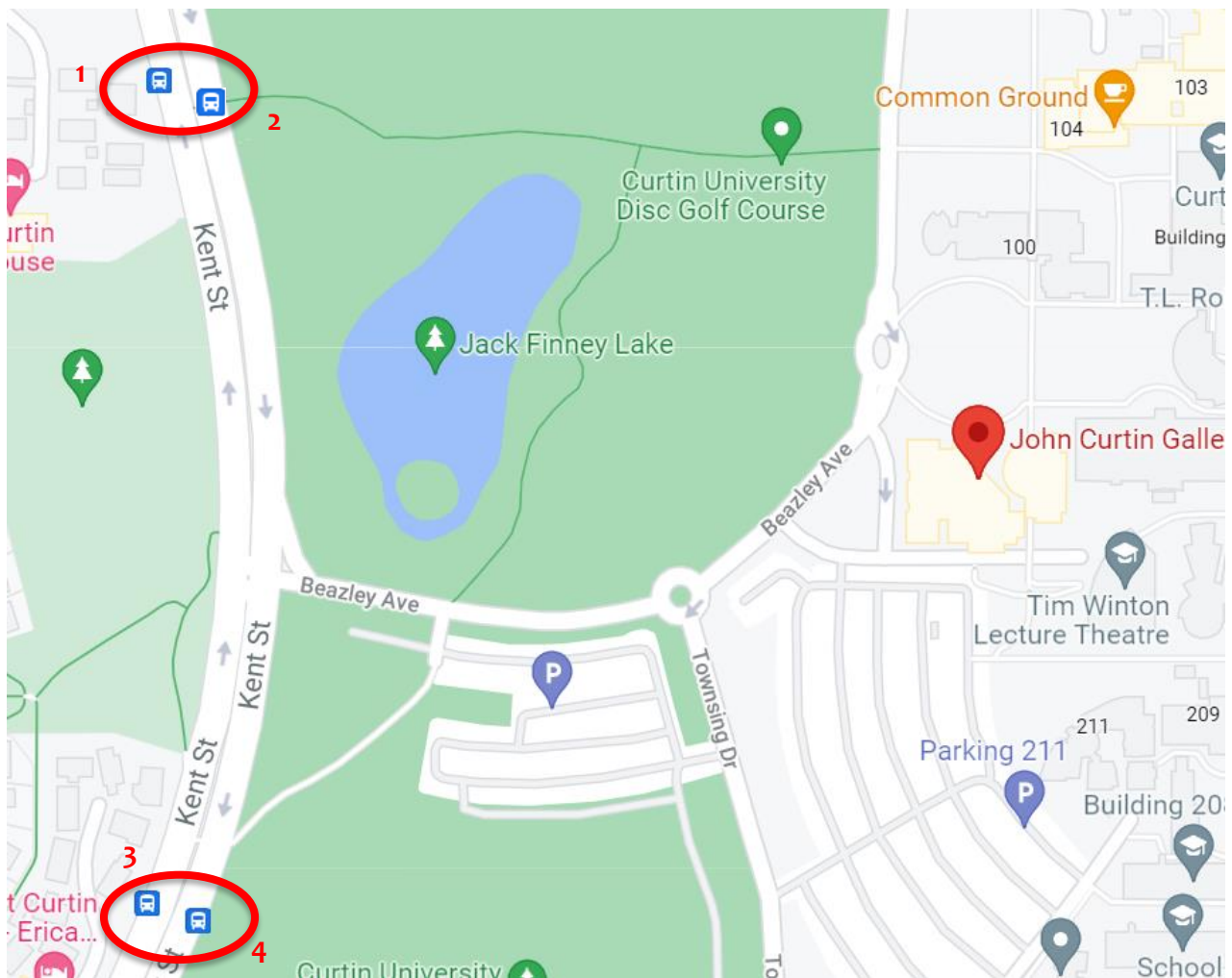
If you are taking public transport to the gallery, you can plan your trip here:

There are four bus stops close to the Kent St entrance of Curtin University:

1. Kent St before Jackson Rd (Stop ID 23925)
2. Kent St after Jackson Rd (Stop ID 23926)
3. Kent St before Beasley Av (Stop ID 23924)
4. Kent St after Beasley Av (Stop ID 23927)
